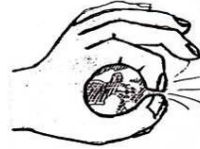

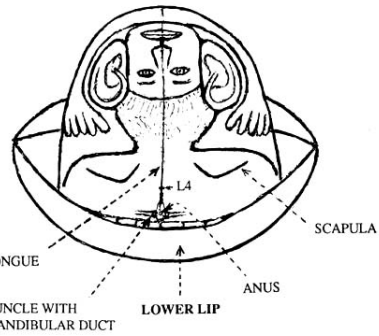
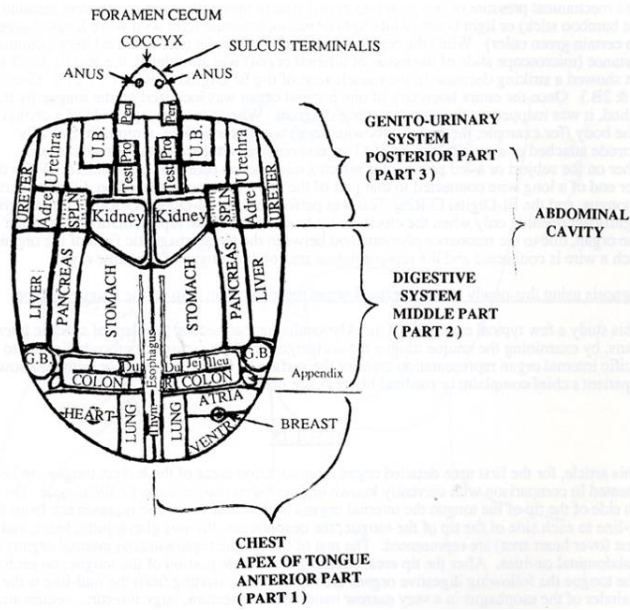


Figure 3B: Accurate Organ Representation Areas of the Under Surface of the Tongue Showing Homunculus Localized by Y. Omura Using Bi-Digital O-Ring Test Resonance Phenomena. Apex of the under side of the tongue represents front of neck, followed by face, top of head, back of head, back of neck, and back of trunk. Near the base of the under surface of the tongue where frenulum of the tongue becomes broader and sublingual caruncle with opening of submandibular duct of each side is located, the central area between these ducts corresponds to the anus representation area. Location of the lower extremities at peripheral parts of the tongue were not shown for the sake of simplicity of the diagram in a small space but will be presented in subsequent reports. Note the disproportionately large representation areas of both ears and the disproportionately small representation area of the entire back. Representation areas for the arms and hands are located on the periphery of the tongue, and note the location for the finger representation area.

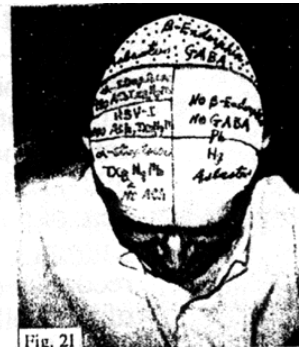
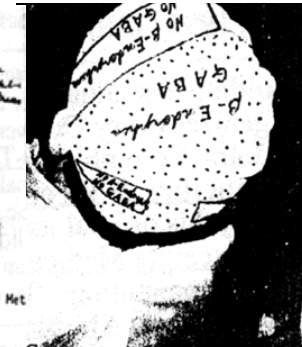

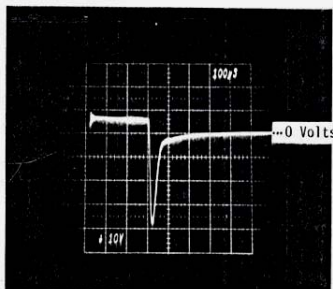
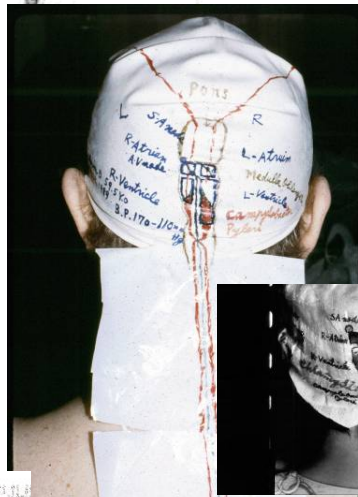


Fig. 0E: Output voltage waveform of WQ-10C at the relative intensity setting = 3 and its basic electrical parameters.



Methods of Estimating Normal Blood Pressure at Different Parts of the Body in a Sitting Position in a Chair

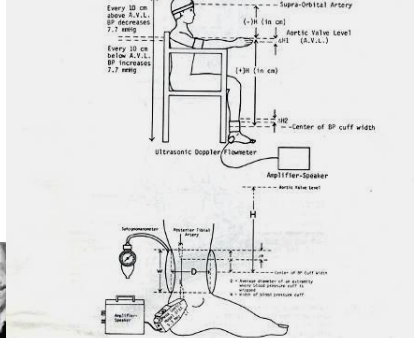


Fig. 0A. In this schematic diagram, only the left leg is shown for convenience of illustration. Every 10 cm away from the aortic valve level on the vertical axis, the blood pressure change due to gravitational effect alone is about 7.7 mmHg/10 cm for Δh (cm). The vertical distance $-h$ (cm) above the aortic valve level corresponds to a decrease in B.P. of $-h \text{ (cm)} \times 7.7 \text{ mmHg} = -h \times 7.7 \text{ mmHg}$ from the (B.P.)_{A.V.} at the aortic valve level, which is roughly equivalent to the brachial artery B.P. measured at the 3rd intercostal level as shown above. The vertical distance h (cm) below the aortic valve position corresponds to an increase in B.P. of $h \times 7.7 \text{ mmHg}$ from the B.P. at the aortic valve level. [113,125,126]

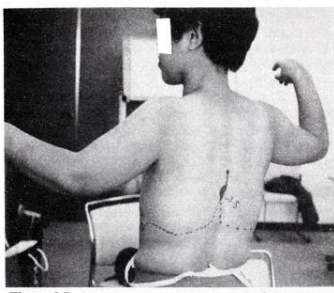

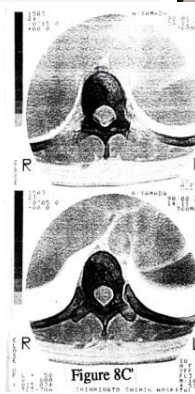

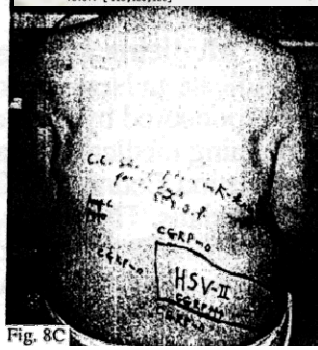
